Complete Control Music Reaches New Heights

In May 2009 CMW was named as a joint sponsor of the Reach the Heights project. This major project has been awarded £27 million from the European Social Fund. It aims to raise the skills and aspirations of young people across West Wales and the Valleys to help them build a brighter future by staying in education or finding a job or training. It will target support locally to improve confidence, decision-making and basic skills.

The Deputy First Minister Ieuan Wyn Jones said "Reach the Heights is a major investment in the future of our young people. This investment is just part of our commitment to helping young people develop their full potential and in turn, make a valuable contribution to the Welsh economy."

CMW will run a project called Complete Control Music 14-19 (CCM). CCM works with 14-19 year olds interested in, or already making music. It is a mentoring scheme which gives practical advice on the music industry along with opportunities to promote and develop their work, offering

recording opportunities, possible releases, gigs, support and advice.

This project works with a wide range of young people from many different musical genres, from singer songwriters to bands to DJs. CCM pairs young people with mentors who have worked professionally within the music industry to provide specialised face to face mentoring. It targets disaffected young people who may not reach their full potential through traditional learning, and through recognising and encouraging their musical talents seeks to improve their sense of worth, self confidence, communication, business skills and enable them to create a brighter future for themselves.

We have run a similar scheme to this in the past targeting those over 18 and worked with musicians who have gone on to be in internationally recognised bands such as Lostprophets, Stereophonics, Bullet For My Valentine, Funeral For a Friend, Akira the Don, Goldie Lookin Chain, Amy Wadge, Mclusky, Jarcew and Future of the Left.

Community Music Wales held a three day percussion workshop for a large group of enthusiastic aspiring drummers in March. Over 50 participants showed up to learn a range of new rhythms on each day of the course.

Five tutors led workshops in a range of different rhythms including Samba, Cuban, African and Latin styles. Participants were able to mix and match different skill areas to make an interesting and varied few days.

Classes helped improve confidence, communication and motivation amongst the group members and participants received an OCN accreditation in live performance,

Samba or hand drumming.

At the end of the course the participants showcased their new drumming skills to a massive audience of friends and family.

Project Officer Gethin Evans who organised the event said; "The 3 days were a great success and this was reflected in the feedback we received from all who attended. Seeing so many people from all backgrounds and ages come together to make music, made an unforgettable experience"

The course took place at Hendre Hall in Tal-y-bont Bangor from 20th - 22nd March.

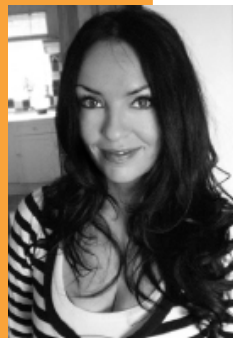

CMW Training Raises Standards Across Wales

In the past few months Community Music Wales has held a range of training events including three Tutor Training courses for people wishing to deliver music workshops in the community.

The courses were all OCN accredited and were designed to raise the standards in Community Music practise across Wales.

In addition to these courses Community Music Wales held a free 'Visual Awareness' training workshop.

Gethin Evans, Project Officer in North Wales said: "These courses has proven so successful with many people showing up to both the tutor training and the visual awareness training. It's great seeing how keen people are to raise the bar for community practise across Wales. I'm sure these participants will now apply the skills learnt to their day to day work, as a result of the courses"

CMW Takes Drumming and Puppet-Making to Caerphilly Flower Festival

Following years of successful music workshops in Caerphilly Parks, this year Caerphilly Council invited Community Music Wales to hold drumming and puppet making workshops as part of the Caerphilly Flower Show over the weekend of the 27th and 28th of June.

The drummers enjoyed two lovely days of Welsh summer sunshine for the workshops and lots of Flower Festival-goers showed up to join in the sessions.

Participants played drums from the west of Africa and were able to explore a range of African beats with the help of the tutors. As the participants got in the rhythm they drew a big crowd to play their newfound skills to.

Whilst the drumming went ahead participants were also invited to use a range of craft materials and create a puppet of their choice, to the sound of the rhythms.

Chris Dawson Project Officer for CMW said

"It worked really well combining the different activities of the music and craft in the one space. The workshop proved to be a very easily accessible and enjoyable day and we had lots of families show up who were able to all join in together"

Cardiff Communities Create Gypsy and Traveller Songs

Earlier in the year Community Music Wales worked with Gypsy and Traveller communities to produce a piece of music based on the Gypsy culture. Workshops explored Gypsy and Traveller customs and traditions in order to facilitate the creation of lyrics that represent the Gypsy way of life.

The young people worked in various areas in order to produce a range of techniques for the final piece of music. Workshops in lyric writing and singing techniques including rap and MCing were also held during the day and participants had a chance to explore a range of musical styles and develop their

interest, as well as gain OCN accreditation.

Running alongside these sessions were workshops in music composition using virtual studio software and more 'traditional' instruments such as guitars, drums and percussion instruments.

Using the material produced in these music workshops as inspiration, the group spent the following weeks of workshops making a video piece to go with the music track and images generated. Two videos were created, one by participants from the Rover Way site and the other by Shire Newton site residents to represent their respective communities.

The video was shown at a presentation and awards evening in March, when the project sessions came to an end.

DIARY OF EVENTS

July 24th – August 21st

Commissioned by Torfaen County Borough Council Streetfonix will see 2 groups of 14-16 year olds involved in creating music based on issues of anti-social behaviour. This will take place over a 5 week period of songwriting workshops and will raise awareness on the subject.

3rd August

Following two months of rehearsal and development with the expertise of Tew Shady two newly formed bands will take to the stage at the Eisteddfod in Bala for the long-awaited performance

3rd – 5th August

CMW will be giving a group of 11-16 year olds from Cardiff the opportunity to write, rehearse and perform their own original material over a three day course of music workshops. The work will be performed to family and friends on the final day

6th August

Over 6 weeks CMW will be holding two hour songwriting sessions with two groups of 8-18 yr olds in Llangefni. The young people will work with CMW and Communities First to create original pieces of music for performance.

7th August

These songwriting workshops organised in conjunction with Cymmer Ward Communities 1st will give participants the chance to learn a new instrument. Workshop attendees can pick up a guitar, bass, keyboards, or drums to play whilst partaking in singing and songwriting during the lively sessions.

7th, 14th & 21st August

Community Music Wales are holding a range of music workshops over the summer for people with physical and learning difficulties. Participants will explore sound and texture of instruments using the sounds of rock, pop, soul, funk and other genres to learn new skills, gain confidence and self-esteem as well as have fun!

12th August

Cyngor Gwynedd play scheme will be taking up percussion instruments to create new samba rhythms! CMW Tutors will be on hand to show the participants how it's done.

13th August

This two hour rap workshop will see participants of Maes Incla learn how to write and perform their own piece of rap music. There will also be a chance to learn how to beat box from the experts

14th August

This two hour CMW workshop in song composition will help Cyngor Gwynedd play scheme participants how to structure and play their own original pieces of music.

9th September

'Visual Awareness' Training with Community Music Wales and RNIB. Free training workshop for anyone wishing to work with visually impaired people. The practical session will be held in Cardiff. For more information please contact admin@communitymusicwales.org.uk

Yn ystod y misoedd diwethaf mae Cerdd Gymunedol Cymru wedi cynnal nifer o ddiwyddiadau hyfforddi yn cynnwys tri chwrs Hyfforddi Tîwtoriaid ar gyfer pobl sy'n dymuno cynnal gweithdai cerdd yn y gymuned.

Mae CCM yn parhau pobl ifanc gyda mentoriaid sydd wedi gweithio'n broffesiynol yn darparu mentora arbenigol wnebu yn wyneb. Mae'n targedu pobl ifanc sydd wedi eu dadurthio, a fyddai, etfallai, ddim yn cyrraedd eu llan botensial trwy addysg draddodiadol. Dywedodd Dirprwy Brit Weiniog Cymru, Ieuan Wyn Jones "Mae Cyrraedd y Nod yn fuddsoddiad o bwys yn nyfodol ein pobl ifanc.
